

## PASTEPAPER and JOURNAL WORKSHOPS MATERIALS TO BRING FROM HOME

**Necessities for Pastepaper Workshop (Day 1):** The messy materials of the day are paste and paint.

- Wear work clothes that can get wheat paste/paint on them.
- Comfy shoes - you will be standing most of the time, (and paint just might splatter on them, too.)
- Apron with a front pocket where you can keep a dishcloth handy.
- Bag lunch, snacks, and beverage
- Check or cash for payment
- Notebook if you want to take notes for how to do things, make sketches of ideas, etc.
- \*Narrow pointed tweezers for picking up small bits of paper – label with your name (eyebrow tweezers don't work as well)

**Optional for Day 1 only:**

- fun, decorative papers to cut or tear up and stick on for embellishment
- \*fibers to cut up for embellishment (finally, all you thread packrats, you CAN do something with those pretty threads bits you're saving!)
- rubber stamps that have thick lined designs. Fine lines don't work as well.
- dried plant leaves or petals can be stuck into the paste
- any household item with an interesting texture that is washable such as hair curlers, kitchen implements, rubber balls, dog chew toys.....
- glitter, confetti

**Necessities for Pastepaper Journal Workshop (Day 2):** The messy material of the day is glue.

- \*Self-healing cutting mat
- \*Rotary cutter with blade for paper (old blade may be OK, just don't use on fabric afterwards)
- Metal or plastic cutting edge – doesn't have to be a ruler, too. Quilting rulers are terrific.
- Apron and dishtowel
- Bag lunch, snacks, and beverage
- \*Narrow pointed tweezers for picking up small bits of paper – label with your name (eyebrow tweezers don't work as well)

Please mark all your belongings with your name. Sharpie markers will write on most any surface or you can stick a masking tape label on objects.
